Are there programs for me to train staff? Canada Saskatchewan Job Grant (CSJG)

Agriculture, Forestry, Hunting, and Fishing make up approximately 14% of all CSJG applications received.

The following are some examples of training that could be useful to Agriculture Workers:

- MELT Truck Driver 1A
- Bookkeeping / Accounting
- Equine Assisted Learning Certification
- Pesticide Applicator Training
- Payroll Training
- Animal Husbandry
- Leadership & Management Training

*Temporary Foreign Workers do not qualify for CSJG



What are some key questions to consider when recruiting internationally?

- Is the position permanent or temporary?
 - Seasonal, year-round
- Is the position skilled or unskilled?
 - Type of work what will they do everyday
- What are the key skills the employee must have?
 - Language requirements
 - Education
 - Work Experience
 - Certification and licensure
- What budget is available to secure an employee?
 - Wage
 - Accommodations/transportation
- How quickly do you need the employee to start?
- Where can I find potential employees?
- Do I need hire someone?
 - The Foreign Worker Recruitment and Immigration Services Act

What is the Saskatchewan Immigrant Nominee Program?

Criteria for Employer and Candidates (i.e. language levels (CLB 4); Education (minimum 1-year) etc.)

- Employer and industry driven
 - Permanent full-time job offer must include:
 - Hours min. 30 hours/week
 - Median Wage
 - Job description of an current existing position and match nature of business
- NOC 0, A, B or a designated trade in Saskatchewan
 - Examples include Farm Managers, Specialized livestock workers, etc.

<u>NEW - SINP Semi Skilled Pilot 2019-2021*</u>

- NOC 8431: General Farm Worker
- NOC 8432: Nursery and Greenhouse Worker
- NOC 7511: Long Haul Truck Drivers**

*Must have proof of previously worked in Saskatchewan for a minimum of six months

**MELT maybe required and any SGI regulations for A-1 class drivers





What are the steps for the SINP?

Step 1 Employer – Apply for a Certificate of Registration (Labour Relations and Workplace Safety)

Foreign Worker Recruitment and Immigration Services Act Step 2 **Employer** – Apply for an SINP Job Approval Letter (Employer Services Branch) Step 5 **Foreign Worker** – Applies to the SINP (Immigration Services Branch)

Step 6 **Employer** – Pays the federal IRCC employer compliance fee of \$230 prior to the application for work permit (if applicable)

Step 3 Employer – Search Internationally (If applicable)

Step 7 Foreign Worker – Applies for Work Permit and PR

Step 4 Employer – Prepare the Letter of Job Offer

Step 8 Employer – Prepares for worker's arrival
